## 32nd ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting held at  
Kogarah School of Arts on 29th May, 1953.

Gentlemen:

The 32nd Annual Report and balance of your Club again shows a year of great activity.

To gain a representative in the Olympic Games is an honour for any Club, for the third occasion your Club secured an Olympic Athlete when Claude Smeal was selected to represent Australia in the Marathon, at Helsinki in 1952.

Claude Smeal was in action in Korea when selected and flew direct to London to join the Australian Team.

Previous representatives were Ernie Austen, Paris 1924; Basil Dickinson, Berlin 1936.

Probably our outstanding Athlete of the year was Jim Bailey who met with the most unfortunate luck in the Australian Championships at Perth, where he was disqualified for minor incidents by an over zealous W.A. Official protest by Mr. J. Holland, Manager of the N.S.W. team was not successful.

Bailey won the 880 and 1 Mile State Championships, established N.S.W. resident records for the 1 Mile, 4m. 13.2 secs., 1500 Metres, 3m. 56.2., at the Bathurst Landy Carnival on the 4th March Bailey was beaten by inches by Landy and his time for the Mile was 4m. 12.6 sec. He also created new Inter-Club records, 880 yards 1m. 55.4 sec., 1 Mile 4m. 17.4 sec. George Gedge again performed well winning the State 440 yards Championship and in securing 3rd place in the 440 yards Australian Championship at Perth, he recorded 48.6 sec., his best time.

Keith Short, one of our outstanding Juniors won the State 220 yards hurdles title and it would appear he is following in the footsteps of his mentor, Ern Watson.

Dennis Wilson is confirming the excellent impression he made when he first appeared, and during the year he won the Sub-Junior State 1 Mile Championship and the Cross Country title, making a record for the course under very bad conditions at Campbelltown.

An excellent performance was recorded by the Club's Senior Medley Relay Team in winning the State title in 3m. 32.2 sec., a new record for a Club team. The members: J. Bailey, 880 yards, G. Gedge, 440 yards, E. Watson, 220 yards, D. Harvison 220 yards.

Our Juniors were also outstanding in relay events, winning the 4 x 110 yards, 4 x 220 yards. Team Members: K. Short, C. Clarke, R. Shoveller, B. Spence, M. Miles. We were also 2nd in the 1 Mile Medley .

During the distance our younger runners again performed extremely well, the Juveniles, Sub-Juniors and Juniors won the State Teams Races, apart from winning one individual title and two minor places.

Our novice runners were successful in winning the Teams Race also gaining 2nd and 3rd places in the Championship.

Senior distance runners again performed below standard and apparently do not understand that the only way to success is through solid and consistent training.

Club membership of 216 is the third highest in the history of the Club.



## SCHOOLBOY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The St. George Schoolboy Championships were held at the Jubilee Oval, Kogarah on Saturday, 13th September, the conditions were the best for many years, and the marking of the ground was a credit to the Curator, Mr. G. Thompson.

Mr. F. Larcombe was again organiser of the Carnival and Manager on the day, and its success pays further tribute to his ability with this type of work.

The outstanding performers were D. Wilson of Canterbury High, who set new figures for the Open 880 yards and 1 Mile, C. Chamberlain of the Sydney High, who reduced the under 16 years 220 yards by a second, K. Cable of Kogarah I. H. who won three titles, breaking a record and equalling another, all place-getters in the under 14 years high jump broke the record and altogether, 8 records were broken and 4 equalled.

The entries were again up to the standard of the previous years and the results of the Open Pennant: Canterbury High 1st, A. A. Gainsford Shield, Canterbury High, and Kingsgrove won the L. B. Williams Shield for the first time.

## TRACK SEASON REVIEW

### HAWKESBURY—OCTOBER, 1952.

Once again the Track Season commenced with the Annual visit to the Hawkesbury Agricultural College. Club members turned up in full force, and an enjoyable time was had by all.

#### INTER-CLUB COMPETITION.

Teams were fielded in A, C, D, E, and 2 under 16 teams.

**A GRADE:** On paper this team appeared to have an excellent chance of winning the competition, but such chance was ruined by lack of support by some members. G. Gedge, E. Watson and K. Short registered good performances in hurdle events, with A. Hakells well to the fore in both javelin and broad jump events. F. Eggleton once again proved a tower of strength in field games, and was ably supported by G. Salva. J. Bailey was most outstanding in middle distance events. Best performances, 880 yds. 1.55.4 sec. 1 Mile, 4m. 17.4 sec. A. Hakells Javelin 201ft. 4½in. Club finishes 6th.

**C. GRADE:** This team performed extremely well, and credit must go to K. Short, C. Clark, R. Shoveller, B. Pery and B. Spence for their efforts in sprint and hurdle events, and D. Wilson and K. Harper in middle distance events.

**D. GRADE:** Although commencing the season very well, poor attendance towards the latter half of the season robbed this team of possible premiership honours. P. Brereton and P. Dawson were the mainstays of the team, ably supported by D. DeWitt, B. Toovey A. Thomas and P. Sponberg. Finished 5th.

**E. GRADE:** This team registered a creditable performance, with M. Sellwood, M. Miles and T. Randall comprising the sprint team, and O. Lewis and E. Baker registering good middle distance performances. Finished 4th.

**UNDER 16:** The Junior Grades were disappointing, we had the quality but attendance was bad, we finished 3rd, 10 points behind Botany, losing to this team by 1 point really lost us the competition. D. Jolliffe was a consistent performer and shared the best Hop Step and Jump of the season, 41ft. 2½in. D. Quinan shared the best High Jump, 5ft. 2in., B. Bennett and R. Robertson were also good performers and most helpful to the manager, Ern Watson.

### GOULBURN—11th December, 1952.

A small team made the trip to Goulburn to compete against the local athletes, and met with a fair measure of success.

#### STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS—4th and 11th January, 1953.

Club members acquitted themselves very well in the State Championships, winning, in all, 10 titles—7 individual and 3 teams. Championship honours were won by J. Bailey, who once again proved that he is the State's best middle distance athlete by winning the 880 yards in 1m. 56.4s., and the 1 Mile in the record breaking time of 4m. 16.6 s.; G. Gedge, who won the 440 yards in fine style, recording 49.4s., and gaining 2nd placing in both 220 and 440 yards hurdles; A. Hakells who again proved too good for the other contenders by retaining his javelin title with a throw of 186ft. 4in.; K. Short whose fine efforts resulted in winning the junior 220 yards hurdles in 25.8s., and second placing in the junior 120 yards hurdles; J. Chambers, who recorded 44ft. 0½in. to win the junior hop, step and jump, and D. Wilson, who ran a well judged race to win the sub-junior 1 mile in 4m. 34.8s.

C. Clark, who is a much improved sprinter, finished 3rd in the junior 100 yards; B. Toovey gained 3rd place in the sub-junior 1 Mile. In the 90 yards sub-junior hurdles vent, Club members filled all minor places with B. Harwin 2nd, J. Lester 3rd, and M. Badins 4th.

In the 1 mile medley relay, the St. George team comprising J. Bailey, G. Gedge, D. Harvison and E. Watson, proved too strong for the opposition by winning the event in the record time of 3m. 32.2s.

The junior teams kept the St. George flag flying by winning both 4 x 110 yards and 4 x 220 yards relays, and finishing 2nd in the 1 Mile medley.



### AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS—24th and 26th January, 1953.

The 1952 Australian Championships were held in Perth, and three members of your Club—J. Bailey, G. Gedge and A. Hakelis—gained selection in the N.S.W. State Team.

J. Bailey ran a magnificent race to finish 2nd to Victorian John Landy in the 1 Mile Championship, but was subsequently disqualified. He suffered a similar fate in the 880 yards Championship. However, he made amends by giving the N.S.W. Team a winning lead in the Mile Medley Relay. G. Gedge ran well to finish 3rd in the 440 yards, and A. Hakelis finished 2nd in the Javelin Championship. Congratulations to these three fine athletes.

## DISTANCE SEASON REVIEW

The feature which stands out most in our past season was the performance of our sub-junior star, Dennis Wilson, who not only regained his State 1 Mile Sub-Junior Title, but also broke his own course record by 6 sec. in storm conditions never before experienced in the conducting of Athletic events. He also won the Club Sub-Junior 1 Mile Championship by 22 sec. from H. Sherlock in 4m. 43s.

Another fine showing was that of young Maurice Barber, who finished 2nd in the State Juvenile Mile Championships, won the Club 1 Mile Juvenile Championship, and gained the fastest time in all twenty Club events.

This year we had 88 competing members being 40 stronger than last year and once again had the largest membership in N.S.W. Our numbers were made up of 37 Seniors, 12 Juniors, 23 Sub-Juniors and 16 Juveniles.

Dennis Jolliffe ran consistently during the season and was unlucky to strike Barber in such good form.

Warren O'Brien in having his first season in athletics proved he has natural ability. We should see bigger things of him next season now he has a little experience.

Our Senior Team in H. Duncan, C. Lawless and D. Steele has a very good back up. It is hoped that our younger chaps can strike the form required to fill those early places so necessary in teams championship events.

A magnificent looking cup was made available this season by the generosity of Mr. J. Harper, for annual competition on the Club 5 Mile Road Championships. The first man to hold this trophy twelve months was Frank O'Hanlon covering the 5 Mile in 28 min. 0.9 sec.

The annual match race for the "F. McCaffrey" Cup between Western Suburbs and ourselves was this year, held on our own ground at Carborough Park. Wests regained the cup by 45 points to 30.
