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A N N U A L   R E P O R T .

PRESENTED TO THE MEMBERS OF THE ST. GEORGE DISTRICT AMATEUR ATHLETIC CLUB AT THE SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING HELD IN MASONIC HALL, HURSTVILLE, ON 12TH MARCH, 1928.

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Gentlemen,

It gives me great pleasure to place before you this evening the Seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Club for the year ending February 29th, 1928,



and I sincerely hope all members will strive to emulate the deeds recorded in this report and lift our club above all others, both athletically and socially.

During the past year your club more than held its own, gaining considerable success both during the distance season and on the track. The road runners once again carried our colours to repeated victories and maintained their title of Distance champions of N. S. Wales. On the track we have seen a great improvement all round, the men putting their shoulders to the wheel splendidly, which, after the previous season's failure, was very pleasing to your officials.

At this stage I would like to stress this fact, that harmony and good-fellowship among the club members, is the foundation of a club, and I would like all members to take this as a word in season. Continue as you have done during the past, turn out in full force in future seasons, and your club must prosper.

MEMBERSHIP: The financial membership list has risen from 42 to 60, of which the track men number 41. This is a satisfactory increase, but it can be improved if members will only induce their friends to come along.

ACTIVE ATHLETICS - DISTANCE SEASON (Club events): During the 1927 season it was a case of quality rather than quantity, as the average contestants for each event dropped from 14 to 9. Thanks are due to the tradespeople of Rockdale, Kogarah, Carlton and Hurstville for their generous support to our races and it is to be hoped that the fields will be much larger in the coming season. Covering the distance season was a point score competition which was won by a first season runner in E. Baker.

5 MILES CLUB NOVICE CHAMPIONSHIP took place at Hurstville on May 28th 1927 and was won by E. J. Brooke (29m. 45s.) by 53 seconds from E. Baker (30.38) and A. Longhurst (31.48). E. Baker gained the sealed handicap with an allowance of 2m. 10s.

10,000 METRES SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP. held in conjunction with 10,000 Metres State Championship at Randwick on 23rd July, 1927. Title holder, Roy Wright retained his laurels in magnificent style, his time being 34m. 59s. A. Gainsford (35m. 7s.) finished 2nd, with C. B. Weekes (35m 21s.) 3rd.

OPEN HANDICAPS: The feature of last season's open handicaps was the remarkable consistency of club member Alf. Longhurst. In his 8 starts he finished within the first six every time, gaining 1 win, 1 second, and 3 thirds, which was easily the best effort of any runner during the open races. On August 13th, 1927, he won the N. S. W. A. A. A. 2 miles handicap at the Sydney Cricket Ground, thus bringing his list of places to a triumphant end. Fastest time prizes were won by Roy Wright, A. Gainsford and C. B. Weekes, their respective successes being, the St. George 3 miles, Botany 10,000 metres, and South Sydney 3 miles.

ST. GEORGE JOLLEY "BLACK CAT" C. C. OPEN HANDICAP: Conducted by your club on June 25th, 1927, over the usual cross-country course. 68 nominations produced 51 starters, 6 fewer than last year, and the result was as follows: G. White (W. S.) (all. 1m. 50s.) 1st, Roy Wright (St. G. all. 30s.) 2nd, and A. Longhurst (St. G.) (all. 1.35) 3rd. In registering 17m. 4s. R. Wright gained fastest time honours, as well as repeating his 2nd place of last year.

N. S. WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS: For our own club the most successful ever, 3 out of 4 titles being won by our own club members. As a team the club began splendidly, but mishaps caused a bad slur towards the end of the season.

IN THE NOVICE C. C. C. OF N. S. WALES your club members practically repeated the triumphs of the previous year. In winning the individual title Edward J. Brooke fulfilled his earlier promise, though it was only after a great struggle with A. Kaine (Botany) that he did so. His time was 29m. 10s. whilst Kaine finished 5 secs. behind him. With E. J. Brooke, E. Baker 4th, B. Tyson 12th, and A. Longhurst 14th, St. George gained the teams title for the 3rd year in succession. A. Longhurst (all. 2m 15s.) gained 2nd prize in the sealed handicap, the winner being popular W. Hunt, the noted track performer from the East Sydney Club.



N. S. W. SENIOR 10,000 METRES CHAMPIONSHIP, held at Randwick Racecourse on July 23rd, 1927, and won by M. J. Mackenzie (W. S.) (34m. 58s) from Roy Wright (St. G.) (34.59) and A. Gainsford (St. G.) (35.7) St. George congratulate "Jeff" Mackenzie on his second, successive victory, also the surprisingly good effort of Roy Wright, who was only just beaten in the last few strides. In this race your club fulfilled an old ambition, when, for the first time, the club members gained the teams' title by 5 points from Western Suburbs. The team finished as follows: R. Wright 2nd, A. Gainsford 3rd, C. B. Weekes 4th, R. Chadwick 9th, E. Baker 11th, and S. Gainsford 16th. Congratulations men! And we hope you will repeat the performance next time.

✓ August 13th, 1927, saw the 10 MILES TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP OF N. S. W. held at Victoria Park Racecourse. Without going into details it is sufficient to say that the finest runner the club has ever produced in the person of Alleyn Gainsford, created a wonderful record, when he crossed the line a winner for the fourth successive time. His time, 51m. 49s. was well within the record, but once again faulty course measurements robbed him of the honour, truly poor recompense for such a magnificent effort. Weakened by the absence of C. B. Weekes and E. J. Brooke, and the subsequent withdrawal of R. Wright with a damaged heel, St. George went down to Western Suburbs in the teams' race by 15 points. We congratulate the latter Club on its first success in distance racing.

✓ MANLY MODIFIED MARATHON OR 15 MILES CHAMPIONSHIP OF N. S. W., held on September 3rd, 1927, in Manly district. A. Gainsford (St. G.) (1h. 26m. 27s) 1st, R. Bateman (S. S.) (1h. 27m. 52s.) 2nd, M. J. McKenzie (W. S.) (1h. 28m. 43s.) 3rd. A. Gainsford, the holder of the title, gained an easy victory, thus becoming the first 15 miles' champion of the State. The distance in previous years was 12½ miles and did not carry a state title. Western Suburbs gained a fine victory in the teams' race by 5 point from South Sydney.

Australian 10, 000 Metres C. C. C. held on 6th August, at Adelaide. Your club furnished 3 men of the selected six, namely, R. Wright, A. Gainsford, and C. B. Weekes. As the latter was unfortunately unable to make the trip ex-Australasian Champion, F. H. Bailey (W. S.) took his place. With 1st, 3rd, 4th and 7th Victoria scooped the pool, the true cross-country proving too much for the light blues who finished second. Clubmate R. Wright did remarkably well to finish 7th, and more should be heard of this young runner in the near future. We congratulate the men who so worthily represented the Club, also G. R. Hyde on his fine individual win.

AUSTRALIAN AND N. S. W. MARATHON CHAMPIONSHIP (26miles 385 yards 7ins.): This was conducted on August 27th, 1927, after a lapse of 15 years, and took place in Sydney and suburbs. The promoters were the ever progressive officials of your own club, and thanks to the enterprise of J. A. Harris and committee was a huge success. The 40 entries consisted of athletes from N. Z., Tasmania, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia and N. S. W., of which 25 starters faced the starter at Martin place. The late Lord Mayor, Ald. Mostyn, very kindly agreed to start the runners on their long trek, and also to distribute the prizes at the finish. The runners journeyed to Hurstville, and then back to the Sydney Cricket Ground, where they very gladly finished. As a detailed description of the race would entail too much space, it is sufficient to say that the winner, R. F. McHardo (Queensland) emerged triumphant by sheer determined running and good judgment. That wonderful veteran Harold Hayden (Bot. H.) finished a very tired second with R. Bateman (S. S.) gamely sticking to his guns, 3rd. The placed men's respective times were, 3 h. 6m. 23s., 3 hr. 9m. 26s., 3 hr. 13m. 2s. 14 runners completed the course. Of our own clubmates, who started, "Bob" Chadwick was the only one to finish, A. Gainsford and W. Hamer retiring at different stages of the race. Chadwick is the first man in the club to complete a full distance Marathon, and we congratulate a plucky runner on a sterling performance.

With regard to the little known official side of the race, great credit is due to Marathon Secretary, J. A. Harris, whose excellent organisation made possible a successful race. We also wish to thank the Rugby League Assn. of N. S. W. for their kind courtesy in allowing the men to finish on the Sydney Cricket Ground and all who supported the race materially..

MERIT CUP STANDING: The victory of the team in Novice C. C. C. and 10,000 Metres Championships was easily the most outstanding feature in the club's history, especially the latter performance. By his deeds of the past



season A. Gainsford easily proved the greatest stayer in N. S. W., whilst from 10 miles upwards possibly in Australia.

TRACK SEASON (Club events). Favoured by extremely good weather, the club carried out its customary mid-week meetings at Hurstville Oval with great success. An average attendance of 26 runners as against 12 the previous season speaks for itself. The great improvement of the track men has been very pleasing to the club officials, and it augers well for the future. The point score for the season up-to-date shows A. Blythe (40 points) leading from C. Bartlett (28½) and W. Cope (23½ pts). A relay competition, which was a great success shows W. Cope leading (19 pts.) from C. Bartlett (15 pts). Trophies were presented by E. J. Brooke and H. A. Taylor.

INTER CLUB COMPETITION, conducted by the N. S. W. A. A. A. once again proved popular and beneficial to all athletes. We congratulate the youthful Kensington team on their fine win in the "B" division, and we cannot overlook our own club-mates' efforts in the same division. In my opinion it has been the turning of the tide, as the club after occupying the bottom position last season finished a very close fourth, so that in two vital contests the club were defeated by a very narrow margin only.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS. Held at Hurstville Oval (commencing 21st Feb. 1928) and Sydney Sports Ground (com. 25th Feb., 1928). The most outstanding features were R. Wright's record 3 miles' run, and the fact that 9 senior titles changed hands. 3 Senior and Junior records were broken, whilst the great struggle between R. Wright and E. J. Brooke in 3 miles' run was voted the best in the history of the race. The time 15.55 4/5 created a new record, whilst C. Laughton broke the existing 3 miles' walk record, registering 23m F. Matson's effort of 31 feet broke the former record by. Results were as follow:-

With a throw of 155' 9" the former gained second place in the Javelin throw and his effort was a welcome return to his old form. By finishing second in the 1 mile run championship Blythe put up a sterling performance, and title honours will soon come his way in the near future.
